

Durham Gilesgate Primary School Sports Premium 2018-2019

Our Sports Premium allowance for the academic year 2018-2019 is £17,510. The premium will be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

This information has been used to enhance the use of sports premium and sporting opportunities for children in school.</p> <p>The PE coordinator was supported in developing a robust plan for the spending of the sport premium and its impact in school. This highlighted areas for development and further enhanced the coordinator's knowledge.</p> <p>PE coordinator worked with local authority to observe staff in PE to ensure high quality lessons are being delivered. PE coordinator is now able to accurately monitor PE throughout the school. Staff worked with experienced PE teacher regarding planning, assessment and teaching. Joint observations with PE specialist have also taken place to determine the quality of PE delivered across key stages.</p> <p>Staff had the opportunity to work with a qualified PE teacher, both in team teaching and through planning. This was bespoke to the needs of the teacher after staff had completed an audit of their confidence and competency in the delivery of PE. We also had specialist coaches in the school working alongside staff in Gymnastics, multi skills and invasion games to increase their subject knowledge Up skilling of staff has taken place through teachers and TAs working alongside qualified sports coaches and secondary PE specialists.
