

Durham Gilesgate Primary School Sports Premium 2019-2020

Our Sports Premium allowance for the academic year 2019-2020 is £17,502. The premium will be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

This highlighted areas for development and further enhanced the coordinator's knowledge.</p> <p>PE coordinator worked with SSP to look at the assessment for our PE curriculum</p> <p>Staff had the opportunity to work with a qualified PE teacher, both in team teaching and through planning. This was bespoke to the needs of the teacher after staff had completed an audit of their confidence and competency in the delivery of PE. We also had specialist coaches in the school working alongside staff in Gymnastics, multi skills and invasion games to increase their subject knowledge. Up skilling of staff has taken place through teachers and TAs working alongside qualified sports coaches and secondary PE specialists.
